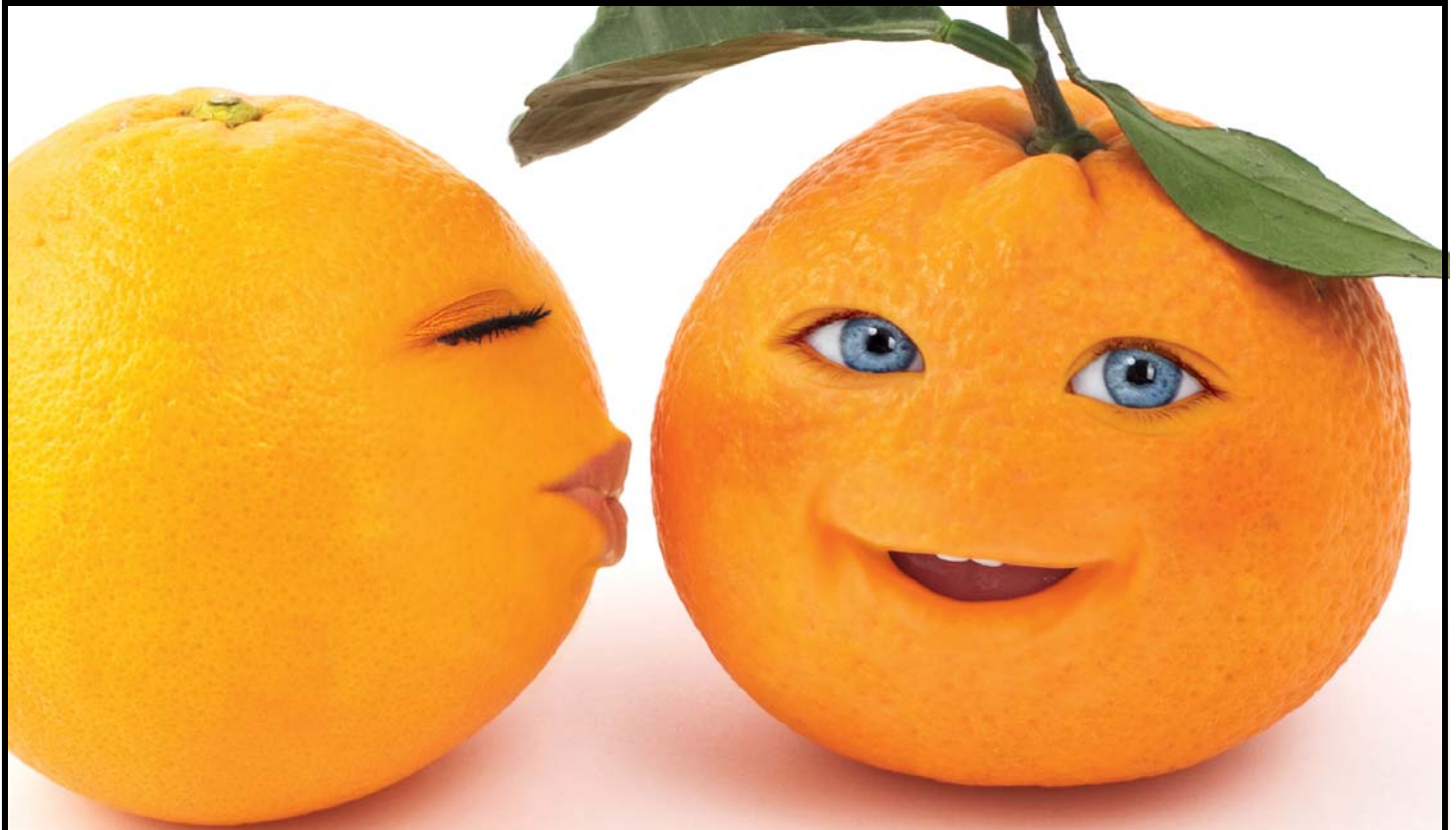
and removal of term limits on officers, matching them with director term limits. Copies of the updated association bylaws are available from the association office.

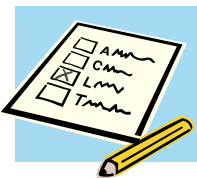

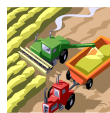

advances allowing sales of not-from-concentrate juice.

## FDOC Update

### Production Trends

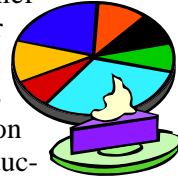
The Florida citrus production trends from 2012/13 to 2020/21 provided by the FDOC suggests Florida citrus production will be maintained at a viable level. The report struggles with the effects of Canker and Greening on future production trends but is generally optimistic research will eventually provide an answer, sustaining the citrus industry.



Psyllid control is also a focus of the report as a factor in reducing infection levels, giving growers the courage to begin replanting. This makes psyllid control a large factor in the report assumptions, which projects future citrus acreage in low, moderate and high categories to give a range of responsibilities. Production orange projections range from 114 million boxes to 139 million boxes. Grapefruit ranges from 13 to 19 million boxes. ### Market Share

The FDOC's position on market share shifted from growing the market to creating a stable market place through maintaining consumer consumption rather than growing it. The rational speculates growth in consumption without growth in production will result in increased imports. The FDOC feels assuring stable consumption during rising prices will be a sizable task in itself. The increases in consumer prices have resulted in the first year over year increase in orange juice revenue in 3 years.



The Domestic Marketing Committee will hold a special meeting to gather input from tax payers on April 20, beginning at 9 a.m. It will be held at the Florida Department of Citrus headquarters in Bartow.



### Budget & Program Plans

The budget will be delayed from the normal May/June timeframe. There

are some outstanding studies afoot, which will not be complete by the earlier timeframe. These reports may have bearing on the program plans and budget. Secondly, the budget is not final until October, creating a double review. This plan is acceptable to the reviewing boards of industry organizations as an efficiency measure.

## Hardee Coordination for Psyllid Control

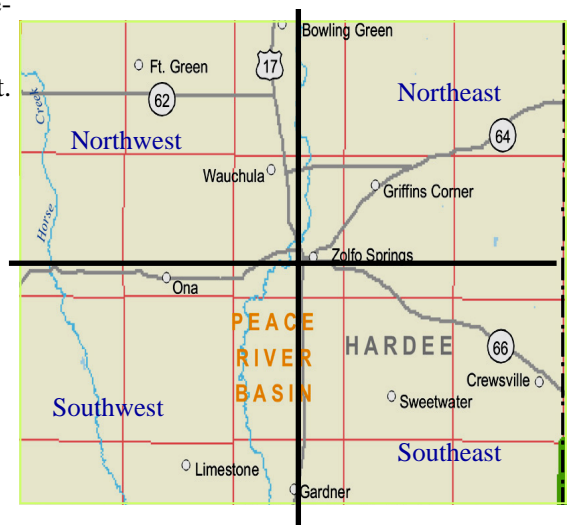
Regional Citrus Agent, Steve Futch is helping organize Hardee County citrus growers for effective psyllid control. The idea is gaining popularity as growers involved in coordination areas are reporting solid results.

The program focuses on coordination of timing and chemistry. The timing is determined by monitoring area psyllid populations and acting when populations rise. The suggested window of action is two weeks. Coordination of chemistry to reduce the chance of the psyllid becoming resistant is also important. There is no coordination of the method of application at this point. Growers are welcome to make applications as they desire, of course, according to labeling.

Hardee County has been divided into four equal sections—see map right. Area captains will lead the charge. They are:

- ◇ Northwest – Roger Conley (Conley Grove Service 863-773-6619) & Jared Revell (Howard Fertilizer 863-214 3027)
- ◇ Northeast – Roger Conley & Darin Hughes (Krause Grove Service 863-735-1286)
- ◇ Southwest – Darin Hughes & Justin Smith (Smith Groves 863-781-3432)
- ◇ Southeast – Keith Farr (Florida Fertilizer 863-781-1464) and Clay Chancey (Chancey Grove Service 863-735-1100)
